

REGULATIONS

1. **ENTRY FEES** – There are no fees to enter an exhibit for an indoor competition, however, some outdoor competitions do charge an entry fee.

2. **ENTRIES** – All entry closing dates and times are in the book and on the entry website. Check carefully as they may vary from section to section. If you have any difficulties, please come into the Show Office. Our volunteers are here to help.

3. DEADLINES FOR EXHIBIT SUBMISSION

- LEGO (D), Wool (G1), Fodder & Grain (H), Craft & Junior Craft (M1), Art (N), Junior Art (O) & Photography (P) exhibits must be at the Elders Pavilion by 7pm, Thursday 26th March 2026.

- Teddy Bears & Dolls (M2) must be at the Elders Pavilion by 5pm, Friday 27th March 2026.

- Farm Produce (I), Fruit Vegetables & Herbs (J), Cookery (K1), Junior Cookery (K2), Jams & Preserves (L), Floral Art & Design (Q) and Cut Flowers (R) must be at the Elders Pavilion from 7:30am to 8.55am on Show Day Saturday 28th March 2026.

- Scarecrow Competition (V) must be dropped off at the Show Office, strictly by 8:55am on Show Day.

For delivery timing of exhibits for Beef Cattle (B), Children's Pet Show (E) and Poultry (F) please check information provided or contact the Convenor/s.

4. **INDOOR JUDGING** – Late entries WILL NOT BE JUDGED. The Elders Pavilion WILL BE CLOSED to members of the public strictly from 9am to about 12pm, to allow judging to take place discreetly. Only Convenors, Judges, Stewards and show committee members are permitted inside while judging takes place – please note, some judging will take place on Friday, 27th March 2026, after 6:00pm.

Entries are strictly not to be removed from the Elders Pavilion before 5:00pm on Show Day. All prize money & gifts to be collected on Show Day, at the Elders Pavilion from Convenors at 5:00pm.

5. **WORKMANSHIP** – All exhibits must be the bona-fide property and/or workmanship of the exhibitor, except in flowers for artistic arrangement. Prize money will not be paid to any indoor exhibit which receives a trophy.

6. **EXHIBIT SLIPS & INVOICES** – All exhibits must have the proper section class Exhibit Slip attached to the entry item, unless listed below. All exhibitors will receive a summary sheet and Exhibit Slips for all entries once entries are confirmed via Showdaysonline via email. You will need to attach the Exhibit Slip with no name on it to your exhibit. Keep the duplicate copy of your Exhibit Slip with your name on it to confirm collection at the end of the Show day. We would appreciate you printing these slips if possible and bring them on the day. Printing facilities are available if needed.

Competitions which do not require Exhibit Slips printed are as follows: Beef Cattle, Children's Pet Show, Dog Jump Competition, Sheaf Tossing , Junior Show People, Junior Judging, Lawn Mower Races, Tractor & Lawn Mower Pulls, Car Demolition Derby, Ute Muster and Circlework.

7. **OUTDOOR JUDGING** – Only Convenors, Judges, Stock Attendants & Exhibitors are permitted in the ring during competition, while judging is in progress. Judges are empowered to decide upon the age of any animal.

8. No exhibit will be accepted if it has previously won a first prize in a Keith Show; the only exception being livestock.

9. The judge's decision shall, in all cases, be final.

10. **PROTESTS** – All protests must be lodged in writing to the Secretary within 60 minutes of the award being made. All protests to be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.00, & to be forfeited to the Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. if the protest is not upheld. In the event of a dispute being over ownership of an exhibit, the exhibit shall become the property of the Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc., who hold the right to dispose of the exhibit at their discretion if the dispute cannot be resolved.

11. **DUPLICATION OF ENTRIES** – No exhibit can be entered in more than one class. This is exempted in Livestock sections.

12. **INCIDENTS** – The Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. will not be responsible under any circumstances for any incidents, losses, negligence, theft and/or damage howsoever caused within the Showgrounds or approved premises of the Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. It is a condition of entry of which all exhibitors shall hold the Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. blameless & indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from, or in respect of such incidents, losses, negligence, theft and/or damage.

13. **AFFILIATION** – The Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. is affiliated with the South East of South Australia & Border Show Societies' Association. Any exhibitor or exhibit that is subject to disqualification by representatives of SESABSSA, or by any other Show Society affiliated with SESABSSA, will be barred from competing at the Keith & Tintinara District Show, or the Show Society itself, during the period the disqualification states, or until an appeal lodged against the disqualification shall be determined.

14. **EXHIBITS FOR DISPLAY ONLY** – The public may be invited to add to the attraction of our show by exhibiting anything rare or choice. 14 days' written notice of request to exhibit is required. Exhibiting your work, as an attraction may incur fees.

15. **COLLECTION** – No collection for any purpose whatsoever may be made without permission by the Executive Committee.

16. **AGGREGATE TROPHY POINTS** – Points are awarded to exhibitors as followed: 1st Place = 5 points; 2nd Place = 3 points; 3rd Place = 1 point. Please note that not all competitions use the Aggregate Points System, nor have the Aggregate Points Trophy. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided on a count-back.

17. **WAIVERS** – In certain circumstances, when directed by the Keith & Tintinara District Society Inc., Waivers MUST be signed by the entrant & witnessed by either the convenor, the Show Entries Officer or the Convenor Liaison Officer, of the Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. If the entrant is aged 17 years & under on Show Day, a parent/guardian MUST be present to co-sign the waiver. Failure to sign the waiver will result in being unable to compete or disqualified from the event. In the event of where a participant competes without signing a waiver & wins a prize, their prizes will be REVOKED.

18. The Keith & Tintinara District Show Society Inc. reserves the right to postpone the date of the Show, or to abandon the Show, should it be deemed advisable to do without incurring any liability.

19. The contents of this book have been carefully compiled and are believed to be correct, but the Keith & Tintinara District Society Inc. will not be responsible in any way for any inaccuracies which may occur herein. Any further updates will be via Showday online.
